

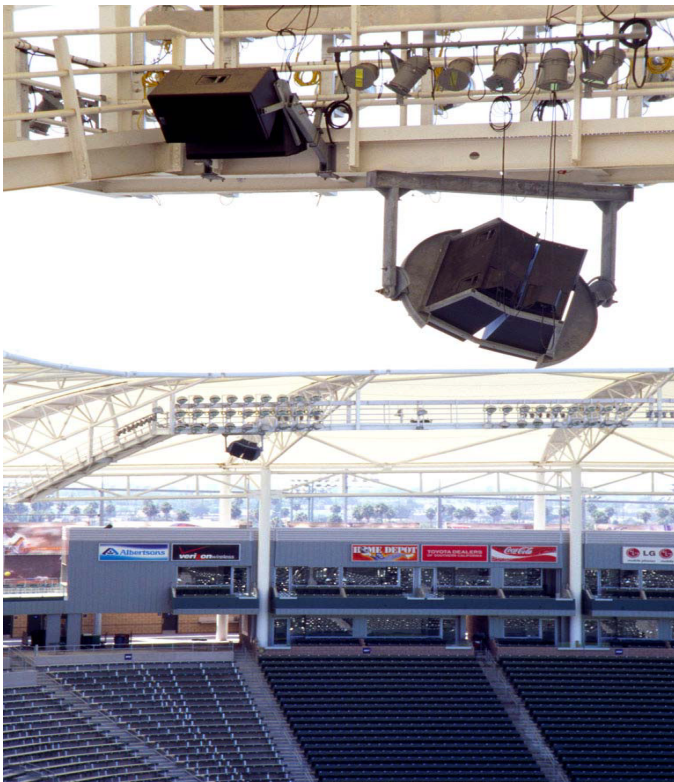
Home Depot Center, Carson, CA

The Home Depot Center is a 125-acre development on the campus of Cal State Dominguez Hills, featuring state-of-the-art stadiums and facilities for soccer, tennis, track & field, cycling, volleyball, baseball, softball, basketball, and other sports. Designated as an "Official U.S. Olympic Training Site," The Home Depot Center is the nations' most complete training facility for Olympic, amateur and professional athletes.

Facilities include a 27,000-seat soccer stadium, 13,000-seat tennis stadium, 20,000-seat track & field facility and a 2,450-seat indoor velodrome. The Home Depot Center is the home of Major League Soccer's 2005 MLS Cup Champion Los Angeles Galaxy and Club Deportivo Chivas USA, and the Los Angeles Riptide of Major League Lacrosse. In addition, the facility is the national team training headquarters of the U.S. Soccer Federation, and the home of the nationally recognized Athletes Performance training sites for USA Cycling, United States Track & Field and the USTA



The Home Depot Center has hosted many major sporting events including the 2003 and 2004 MLS Cup Finals, the finals of the 2003 Women's World Cup, ISA Sevens Rugby tournament, the JP Morgan Chase WTA tennis tournament, and ESPN's Summer X-Games.



- Audio system consisting of distributed Meyer Sound loudspeakers for soccer stadium reinforcement, a distributed system for tennis stadium reinforcement, and several portable systems for ancillary uses.
- Fully wired for broadcast, with low voltage cable installed to key camera positions within the stadiums and environs. This terminates in a patch room for the ability to quickly patch any possible configuration.
