



Staples Center, Los Angeles, CA

Staples Center opened in October 1999, the only arena in the country that is occupied by three major sports franchises; The Los Angeles Kings of the NHL; The Los Angeles Lakers of the NBA, and the Los Angeles Clippers of the NBA. Also the home of the Los Angeles Sparks of the WNBA and the Los Angeles Avengers of the

AFL. The building has hosted the Grammy Awards, the Latin Grammy Awards, the NBA and NHL All-Star games, as well as four consecutive NBA Finals.

- Audio system consisting of large scale clusters for main bowl reinforcement, and a large paging system with approximately 1600 ceiling speakers around the building, as well as 30 autonomous systems in locker rooms, restaurants, etc...
- Fully wired for broadcast, with approximately 3.5 million feet of low voltage cable installed to key camera positions within the bowl and environs. This terminates in a patch room for the ability to quickly patch any possible configuration.
- A High Definition Television studio capable of producing HDTV broadcasts of any event in the building. Used by Fox Sports Net for its' broadcasts from Staples Center.
